

Fogarty HIV-associated TB Training Program at UCT: Requirements and expectations associated with award of Fogarty fellowship funding

This document outlines the requirements and expectations associated with the award of a fellowship by this Fogarty Program at UCT.

Trainees awarded a fellowship are required to:

- 1) Complete the post-graduate degree or short course training program for which the fellowship award was made. The trainee, working under the supervision of their supervisor(s), needs to meet UCT requirements for completion of the degree program when applicable. For post-doctoral fellowships they should work with their supervisor to complete the project as proposed in their application. For short-courses they should undertake all the course assessments and fulfil the requirements of the institution for successfully completing the course program.
- 2) Fulfil NIH requirements for training in Human Subjects Protection and Responsible Conduct of Research (RCR). For our Program this involves having in-person SA GCP training and 8-hours of GCP training which will include blended in-person and on-line learning to make up the 8 hours.
- 3) While at UCT, attend the annual symposium of the Fogarty Program and all seminars organized by the Program where fellows will be asked to present their ongoing research.
- 4) Acknowledge the Fogarty Program support in all research publications that result from projects or training that received funding from the Program with this wording:

“Research reported in this publication was supported by the Fogarty International Center of the National Institutes of Health under Award Number D43 TW010559. The content is solely the responsibility of the authors and does not necessarily represent the official views of the National Institutes of Health.”

or

“XXX received training in research that was supported by the Fogarty International Center of the National Institutes of Health under Award Number D43 TW010559. The content is solely the responsibility of the authors and does not necessarily represent the official views of the National Institutes of Health.”

- 5) Ensure that Kathryn Wood (Kathryn.wood@uct.ac.za) is kept informed regarding all publications, conference presentations and career developments even if the fellow leaves UCT.

Furthermore, fellows are encouraged to pursue research careers in HIV-TB at UCT where opportunities arise. The Program will endeavor to support the funding applications of fellows to funding agencies to support their further HIV-TB research at UCT.
